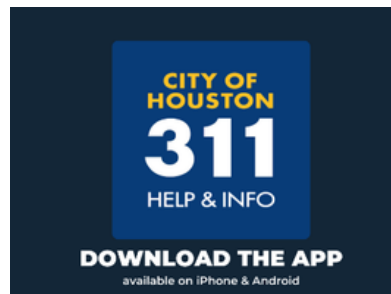

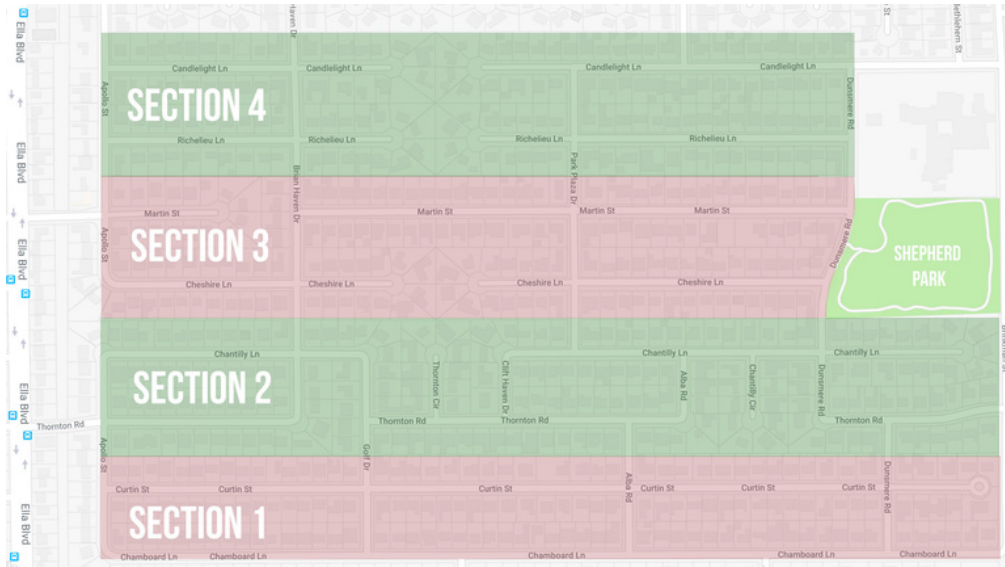

Trash & Recycling Schedule

We highly recommend using the HTX Collects app for updated information. Typically, the schedule for Shepherd Park Plaza is:

- Trash, every Tuesday
- Yard Waste, every Tuesday
- Recycling, every other Tuesday
- Heavy Trash, 3rd Thursday of Even Months (Feb, Apr, June, etc)
- Tree Waste, 3rd Thursday of Odd Months (Jan, Mar, May, etc)



Shepherd Park Plaza Constable Program

Why Your Support Matters

Enhanced Safety & Security for Our Neighborhood

- The Constable program provides 40 hours of dedicated patrols each week in our neighborhood, giving us an extra layer of protection beyond standard police coverage.
- Constables are highly trained, fully commissioned peace officers with quick response times.

Exclusive Neighborhood Patrols & Immediate Access

- Unlike HPD officers, Constables are assigned specifically to Shepherd Park Plaza, meaning they prioritize our streets and respond quickly to any suspicious activity or incidents.
- Every resident has access to the Constable emergency phone number, allowing you to reach an officer directly instead of waiting in a general police queue.

Your Support Keeps the Program Running

- The cost is \$300 per household per year – just 82 cents a day for dedicated law enforcement presence.
- The more households that contribute, the more affordable the program remains for everyone.

Risk of Losing One Constable

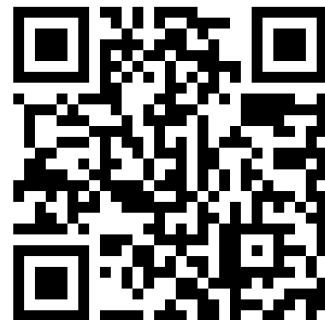
- Right now, we are at risk of dropping from two Constables to just one because we have not collected enough funds to cover the cost.
- Fewer hours of patrols mean slower response times, less visibility, and increased vulnerability to crime.

A United Community Effort

- Whether you pay or not, you still benefit from the program, as the Constables patrol the entire neighborhood and respond to all residents.
